1. Introduction

The Somerset County Park Commission – Lord Stirling Stables located at 256 South Maple Avenue, Basking Ridge, New Jersey is seeking proposals for the following services:

OPTION A – FARRIER SERVICES
OPTION B – EQUINE DENTIST
OPTION C – VETERINARIAN

Respondents may choose to respond to one or more options.

2. Administrative Conditions and Requirements

The following items express the administrative conditions and requirements of this RFP. Together with the other RFP sections, they will apply to the RFP process, the subsequent contract, and project production. Any proposed change, modification, or exception to these conditions and requirements may be the basis for the Somerset County Park Commission, hereinafter referred to as owners, to determine the proposal as non-responsive to the RFP and will be a factor in the determination of an award of a contract. The contents of the proposal of the successful Respondent, as accepted by the owner, will become part of any contract awarded as a result of this RFP.

2.5 Interpretations and Addenda

Respondents are expected to examine the RFP with care and observe all its requirements. All questions about the meaning or intent of this RFP, all interpretations and clarifications considered necessary by the owner's representative in response to such comments and questions will be issued by Addenda posted to website and mailed or delivered to all parties recorded as having received the RFP package. Only comments and questions responded to by formal written Addenda will be binding. Oral interpretations, statements or clarifications are without legal effect.

2.6 Quantities of Estimate

Wherever the estimated quantities of work to be done are shown in any section of this RFP, including the Proposal Cost Form, they are given for use in comparing proposals. The owner especially reserves the right (except as herein otherwise specifically limited) to increase or diminish the quantities as may be deemed reasonably necessary or desirable by the owner to complete the work detailed by the contract. Such increase or diminution shall in no way violate this contract, nor shall any such increase or diminution give cause for claims or liability for damages.

2.7 Cost Liability and Additional Costs

The owner assumes no responsibility and liability for costs incurred by the Respondents prior to the issuance of an agreement. The liability of the owner shall be limited to the terms and conditions of the contract.

Respondents will assume responsibility for all costs not stated in their proposals. All unit rates either stated in the proposal or used as a basis for its pricing are required to be all-inclusive. Additional charges, unless incurred for additional work performed by request of the owner, are not to be billed and will not be paid.

2.8 Statutory and Other Requirements

2.8.1 Compliance with Laws

Any contract entered into between the contractor and the owner must be in accordance with and subject to compliance by both parties with the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law. The contractor must agree to comply with the non-discrimination provisions and all other laws and regulations applicable to the performance of services there under. The respondent shall sign and acknowledge such forms and certificates as may be required by this section.

2.8.2 Mandatory EEO/Affirmative Action Compliance

No firm shall be issued a contract unless it complies with the EEO/Affirmative Action requirements of P. L. 1975, C. 127 as identified in the documents attached hereto. The form shall be properly executed.

2.8.3 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

Discrimination on the basis of disability in contracting for the delivery of services is prohibited. Respondents are required to read American with Disabilities language that is part of the documents attached hereto and agree that the provisions of Title II of the Act are made part of the contract. The contractor is obligated to comply with the Act and hold the owner harmless.

2.8.4 Stockholder Disclosure

No corporation or partnership shall be awarded any contract for the performance of any work or the furnishing of any goods, unless, with receipt of the proposal of said corporation or partnership, there is submitted to the County a statement setting forth the names and addresses of all stockholders in the corporation or partnership who own ten (10) percent or greater interest therein. The Respondent shall complete and submit the form of statement that is included in this RFP.

2.8.5 Non-Collusion Affidavit

The Non-Collusion Affidavit, which is part of this RFP, shall be properly executed and submitted with the RFP response.

2.8.6 N.J. Business Registration Certificate

Certificate required pursuant to C57, PL2004; failure to be registered by time of contract award may be cause for rejection. Entities or individuals that need to file for a certificate may do so on-line through the NJ Division of Local Government Services at the following link:

2.8.7 “Pay to Play” – Notice of Disclosure Requirement – P.L. 2005, Chapter 271, Section 3 Reporting (N.J.S.A. 19:44A – 20.27)

- (1) Any business entity that has received \$50,000 or more in contracts from government entities in a calendar year is required to file an annual disclosure report with ELEC. The instructions and form are available on the ELEC website.
- (2) Annual Disclosures require submission by March 30th of each year covering contracts and contributions for the prior calendar year.

2.8.8 Assign, Sublet or Transfer Any Rights/Interests

Neither the County nor the Contractor shall assign, sublet, or transfer any rights or interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. Unless specifically stated to the contrary, in writing, prior to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the County and the Contractor.

2.8.9 Insurance and Indemnification

If it becomes necessary for the contractor, either as principal or by agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of the owner, the contractor hereby covenants and agrees to take use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards, and protection against the occurrence of happenings of any accident, injuries, damages, or hurt to person or property during the course of the work herein covered and be his/her sole responsibility.

The contractor further covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the owner from the payment of all sums of money or any other consideration(s) by reason of any, or all, such accidents, injuries, damages, or hurt that may happen or occur upon or about such work and all fines, penalties and loss incurred for or by reason of the violation of any owner regulation, ordinance or the laws of the State, or the United States while said work is in progress.

The contractor shall maintain sufficient insurance to protect against all claims under Workers Compensation, General Liability and Automobile and shall be subject to approval for adequacy of protection and certificates of such insurance shall be provided.

Professional Liability/Malpractice Insurance Policy (if applicable)

Coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000.00/occurrence, \$3,000,000.00 aggregate and assurance that each such policy for each staff member remains full and in effect while providing services for the Somerset County Park Commission.

The contractor shall provide the County with a Certificate of Insurance naming the County as additionally insured, evidencing the existence of required insurance prior to the commission of work. Said insurance must include coverage for complete operations, contractual insurance and independent contractor or subcontractor insurance, where and if applicable.

2.8.10 HIPAA (If Applicable)

Both parties agree to comply with all requirements of the Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (“HIPAA”) as maybe amended from time to time, and the corresponding HIPAA regulations for the confidentiality and security of medical information.

The Contractor shall:

- Not use or disclose protected health information other than as permitted or required by law
- Use appropriate safeguards to protect the confidentiality of the information
- Report any use or disclosure not permitted

The contractor, by execution of the contract, shall thereby indemnify and hold the County harmless from any and all liabilities, claims, actions, costs and penalties which may be incurred as the result of the failure of the contractor to comply with the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) or any other statute or case law protecting the privacy of persons using its services.

2.8.11 Proof of Licensure

Proof of licensure for providing Professional Services in the State of New Jersey, for either the firm or the person responsible for the work, shall be provided as required.

2.8.12 Disclosure of Investment Activities in Iran

P.L. 2012, c.25 prohibits State and local public contracts with persons or entities engaging in certain investment activities in energy or finance sectors of Iran.

2.9 Public Emergency

In the event of a Public Emergency declared at the Local, State or Federal Level, if the County opts to extend terms and conditions of this RFP, the contractor agrees to extend the terms and conditions of this RFP, whether existing, expiring or expired no longer than six months, for services for the duration of the emergency. In the event the original contractor cannot meet this requirement, the County may solicit the services from any respondent to this RFP.

2.10 Multiple Proposals Not Accepted

More than one proposal from an individual, a firm or partnership, a corporation or association under the same or different names shall not be considered.

2.11 Failure to Enter Contract

Should the respondent, to whom the contract is awarded, fail to enter into a contract within ten (10) days, Sundays and holidays excepted, the owner may then, at its option, accept the proposal of another respondent.

2.12 Commencement of Work

The contractor agrees to commence work after the date of award by the owner and upon notice from the using department.

2.13 Termination of Contract

If, through any cause, the contractor shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner obligations under the Contract or if the contractor violates any requirements of the Contract, the owner shall thereupon have the right to terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the contractor of such termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed effective date of the termination. Such termination shall relieve the owner of any obligation for the balances to the contractor of any sum or sums set forth in the Contract.

The contractor agrees to indemnify and hold the owner harmless from any liability to subcontractors/suppliers concerning payment for work performed arising out of the lawful termination of the Contract by the owner under this provision.

In case of default by the contractor, the owner may procure the services from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.

2.14 Non-Allocation of Funding Termination

Each fiscal year payment obligation of the owner is conditioned upon the availability of owner funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such an obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of any services performed by the Contractor hereunder, whether in whole or in part, the owner at the end of any particular fiscal year may terminate such services. The owner will notify the Contractor in writing immediately of any services that will be affected by a shortage of appropriated funds. This provision shall not be construed so as to permit the owner to terminate this Agreement during the term, or any service hereunder, merely in order to acquire identical services from a third party contractor.

2.15 Force Majeure

Neither party shall be responsible for any resulting loss or obligation to fulfill duties as specified in any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement if the fulfillment of any term or provision of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any revolutions, insurrections, riots, wars, acts of enemies, national emergencies, strikes, floods, fires, acts of God, or by any cause not within the control of the party whose performance is interfered with which by the exercise of reasonable diligence such party is unable to prevent. Additionally, if the fulfillment of any of the terms and provisions of this Agreement is delayed or prevented by any court order, or action or injunction or other such agreement, this Agreement shall become voidable by the County of Somerset by notice to each party.

2.16 The County and the Contractor each bind themselves and their successors, executors, administrators, heirs and assigns and legal representatives of the other party respecting all covenants and agreements and obligations of this contract.

2.17 The terms of this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted, and all respective rights and duties of the parties shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey.

2.18 Challenge of Specifications

Any respondent who wishes to challenge a specification shall file such challenge in writing with the Purchasing Agent no less than three (3) business days prior to the opening of the RFP's.

Challenges filed after that time shall be considered void and having no impact on the owner or the award of contract.

2.19 Payment

Invoices shall specify, in detail, the period for which payment is claimed, the services performed during the prescribed period, the amount claimed and correlation between the services claimed and the Proposal Cost Form.

Payment will be made on presentation of owner's voucher duly signed and executed.

The owner may withhold all or partial payments on account of subsequently discovered evidence including but not limited to the following:

- 1 Deliverables not complying with the project specification;
- 2 Claims filed or responsible evidence indicating probability of filing claims;
- 3 A reasonable doubt that the Contract can be completed for the balance then unpaid.

When the above grounds are removed, payment shall be made for amounts withheld because of them.

2.20 Non-payment of Penalties and Interest on Overdue Bills

State Law requires that public funds be used to pay only for goods delivered or services rendered. Somerset County will not pay penalties and/or interest on overdue bills. No employee is authorized to sign a letter of credit or any other document that represents a legal commitment on the part of the owner to pay additional fees.

2.21 Ownership of Material

The owner shall retain all of its rights and interest in any and all documents and property both hard copy and digital furnished by the owner to the contractor for the purpose of assisting the contractor in the performance of this contract. All such items shall be returned immediately to the owner at the expiration or termination of the contract or completion of any related services, pursuant thereto, whichever comes first. None of the documents and/or property shall, without the written consent of the owner, be disclosed to others or used by the contractor or permitted by the contractor to be used by their parties at any time except in the performance of the resulting contract.

Ownership of all data, materials and documentation originated and prepared for the owner pursuant to this contract shall belong exclusively to the owner. All data, reports, computerized information, programs and materials related to this project shall be delivered to and become the property of the owner upon completion of the project. The contractor shall not have the right to use, sell, or disclose the total of the interim or final work products, or make available to third parties, without the prior written consent of the owner. All information supplied to the owner may be required to be supplied on CD-ROM media compatible with the owner's computer operating system, windows based, Microsoft Office 2003 professional.

2.23 Source of Specifications/RFP Packages

Official County Request for Proposal (RFP) packages for routine goods and services are available from www.co.somerset.nj.us/notice.html at no cost to the prospective respondents. All addenda are posted on this site. Potential respondents are cautioned that they are responding at their own risk if a third

party supplied the specifications that may or may not be complete. The County is not responsible for third party supplied RFP documents.

2.24 Altering Official Document

Respondents shall not write in any margins or alter the official content of the Somerset County Park Commission RFP document.

2.25 W-9

3. Scope of Work (SOW)

Respondents have the option to respond to one or more of the services.

Respondents must submit a Statement of Qualifications and a minimum of three references for each service they are responding to.

Description of Lord Stirling Stable

Lord Stirling Stable, located at 256 South Maple Avenue in the Basking Ridge section of Bernards Township is a recreational equestrian facility offering instruction in English horsemanship for youth and adults from beginner through over fences. There are approximately 70 horses and 10 ponies. Special events and horse shows are also conducted. There is a 14-mile trail system, and horses are available to rent for trail rides.

All vendors shall provide in a timely manner, a monthly itemized bill which shall include the date of work and services rendered as it pertains to each individual horse.

Farrier

The Farrier must have a minimum of 3 years professional experience in proper trimming techniques, and the sizing, shaping, and application of various types of shoes, so as not to cause harm to the horse/pony. The Farrier must have attended and successfully completed a recognized farrier school or taken and successfully passed a recognized farrier course through an accredited educational institute or farrier's association. Proof of successful course completion must be provided with the proposal response. The Farrier must be able to recognize soundness issues related to the horse's foot (i.e. abscesses, thrush, corns, contracted heels, Navicular, etc.) and their treatment as related to shoeing, trimming, and foot care.

The Farrier must have his/her own equipment to perform the necessary services, and must be able to supply the various types of shoes, pads, and other supplies required for proper hot shoeing. The Farrier must be available a minimum of two weekday mornings per week for routine shoeing, trimming, and hoof care. Work may be started no earlier than 8am and must be completed no later than 4pm to coordinate with the Stable's lesson schedule. Farrier services cannot be provided on Wednesday, Saturday, Sunday, or closed Holidays unless there is an emergency as defined by the Stable. The Farrier must be willing to adjust work schedule as requested during scheduled lesson session breaks.

The Farrier must be willing to work in conjunction with the veterinarian and Somerset County Park Commission staff as necessary. Each horse/pony is routinely trimmed/shod every six to eight weeks. The Farrier must be willing to shoe/trim all horses/ponies housed on site.

Equine Dentist

The Equine Dentist must have a minimum of 3 years professional experience in performing scheduled oral exams and emergency oral care. An oral exam and any required dental work including, but not limited to floating and tooth extraction is performed on each horse annually. Sedation is to be used as necessary.

The Equine Dentist must: be either a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey or a person specializing in Equine Dentistry acting under the direct supervision of a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey in accordance with NJ ST 45:16-9.7. The Equine Dentist must be licensed to administer sedation to the horse or work with a licensed veterinarian responsible for the sedation.

If the Equine Dentist is not a veterinarian licensed to practice in New Jersey, the Equine Dentist must supply the name of the supervising veterinarian with the proposal. The licensed veterinarian must submit proof of a valid New Jersey Veterinary license, and must all submit all statutory documentation required with this proposal.

The Equine Dentist is needed to perform on each horse on a yearly basis routine dental maintenance including but not limited to an exam, floating of hooks, waves, ramps, steps, ridges, reduction, incisor realignment, tartar removal, flushing of pockets, and bit seat.

Each Equine Dentistry proposal must define what is included in a scheduled routine dental exam, the average time needed per exam, the type of sedation used, and a general estimate of the cost of the exam so that the information may be used for a comparison basis and general evaluation purposes.

Veterinarian

The Equine Veterinarian or Veterinary group must be licensed to practice in the State of New Jersey, have a minimum of 3 years professional practice experience, and provide proof with their response. Sole practicing Veterinarians must provide the name(s) of any covering Veterinarians/Practices to be used when their service is not available. Covering Veterinarians/Practices must submit all statutory documentation required with this proposal and meet the minimum requirements of professional experience. The Equine Veterinarian shall be available 24/7 for emergency calls to treat colic, wounds that require immediate suturing, and all other medical needs that require prompt attention. The Veterinarian must be available to perform lameness checks and other routine medical services as necessary. Lameness checks and other routine medical services are regularly scheduled for Wednesday mornings. Additional visits will be scheduled as necessary. When not available, the sole Equine Veterinarian shall arrange coverage from another Equine Veterinarian/Group licensed to practice in the State of New Jersey.

All horses receive Tetanus, Encephalitis, Potomac Fever, Botulism, West Nile Virus, and Rabies vaccinations supplied and administered by the Veterinarian once a year. Rhinopneumonitis and Influenza vaccinations are given twice a year. The veterinarian must be able to draw blood and submit sample(s) to the State lab for Coggins test(s) as necessary.

All horses/ponies are de-wormed on a regular schedule determined by the Veterinarian based on industry research recommendations and/or fecal egg count analysis. The de-worming medication may be supplied by the Veterinarian or by the Park Commission, at the Park Commission's discretion.

Pharmaceuticals including but not limited to Phenylbutazone, Isoxuprine Hydrochloride, Trimethoprim Sulfamethoxazole, Penicillin Antibiotics, Dexamethasone, Flunixin Meglumine, Pergolide, Pentosan, Adequan, and other medicinal drugs as prescribed must be available by prescription to be obtained by the Park Commission or in stock and/or supplied by the Veterinarian on each visit as necessary.

Newly donated or purchased horses require a thorough health and soundness examination performed by the Veterinarian. The exam will consist of – inspection of any breed registration papers and Coggins test for accuracy; determination of the horse's age by dental nomenclature; listening to lungs and heart; inspection of the eyes; and an overall conformation and soundness evaluation to determine if the horse is suitable to be utilized in the Lord Stirling Stable riding program.

The Veterinarian must be able and willing to work in conjunction with the Farrier and Somerset County Park Commission staff as necessary. The Veterinarian must be willing to treat all horses/ponies housed on the site.

Veterinarian must submit a copy of their New Jersey Veterinary License along with their proposal.

4. Proposal Requirements

4.1 Qualification Statement

A statement is to be provided by the respondent who will serve as the primary contractor. The statement shall set forth brief details of the firm's principal activities, the number of personnel in the firm and the firm's location. Please provide a list of (3) three clients for whom similar services have been provided. Include the following in your response:

1. Name of government agency or comparable private entity.
2. Contact person's name, position, and current telephone number.
3. Dates, cost and scope of service.
4. Status and comments

4.2 Key Personnel Information

The respondent shall provide the identity and the credentials of the principals and other key personnel working for the contractor and their areas of responsibilities.

4.3 Proposal Forms

4.4 Location of Servicing Office

The proposal must list the location and address of the present, active office that will service and manage this contract.

5. Evaluation, Review and Selection Process

5.1 Proposals to Remain Subject to Acceptance

RFP responses shall remain open for a period of sixty (60) calendar days from the stated submittal date. The owner will either award the Contract within the applicable time period or reject all proposals.

The owner may extend the decision to award or reject all proposals beyond the sixty (60) calendar days when the proposals of any respondents who consent thereto may, at the request of the owner, be held for consideration for such longer period as may be agreed.

5.2 Rejection of Proposals

The owner reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or to reject any proposals if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of such respondent fails to satisfy the owner that such respondent is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the RFP and to complete the work contemplated therein. The owner reserves the right to waive any minor informality in the RFP.

5.3 Evaluation Process

An evaluation team will review all proposals to determine if they satisfy the Proposal Requirements, determine if a proposal should be rejected and evaluate the proposals based upon the Evaluation Criteria. The highest-ranking respondent will then be recommended to the governing body for award of contract, based on price and other factors.

5.4 Evaluation Criteria

The criteria considered in the evaluation of each proposal follows. The arrangement of the criteria is not meant to imply order of importance in the selection process. All criteria will be used to select the successful respondent.

5.4.1 Understanding of the Requested Work

The proposals will be evaluated for general compliance with instructions and requests issued in the RFP. Non-compliance with significant instructions shall be grounds for disqualification of proposals.

5.4.2 Knowledge and Technical Competence

This includes the ability of the respondent to perform all of the tasks and fulfill adequately the stated requirements.

5.4.2.a. Management, Experience and Personnel Qualifications
